

FALKLAND PALACE ROYAL TENNIS COURT PAPER/CARDBOARD MODEL KIT

DIRECTIONS:

1) PRINT OUT THESE SHEETS TO ANY SIZE YOU DESIRE FOR YOUR MODEL. (DIFFERENT PRINTERS WILL OFFER DIFFERENT LEVELS OF SCALING ABILITIES FOR ADOBE PDF FILES.)

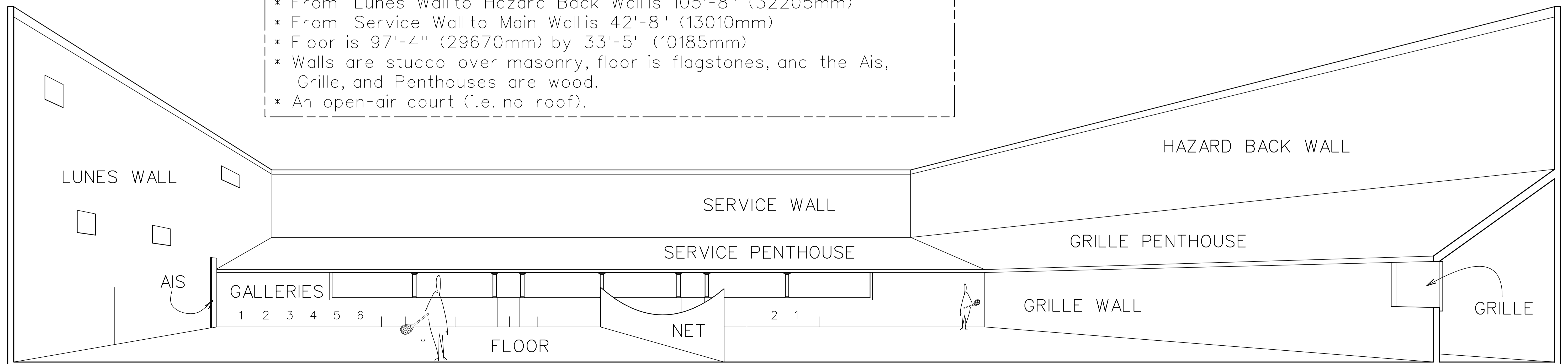
2) SELECT A BACKING MATERIAL OF APPROPRIATE THICKNESS. (VERY SMALL MODELS CAN BE MADE BY PRINTING THESE SHEETS ON STIFF PAPER, AND DO NOT NEED BACKING.) LARGER MODELS WILL REQUIRE CHIP-BOARD (CARDBOARD), FOAM CORE, OR CORRUGATED CARDBOARD.

3) SPRAY SUFFICIENT ADHESIVE (SUCH AS "SPRAY-MOUNT") ONTO AN AREA OF BACKING MATERIAL LARGE ENOUGH FOR EACH SHEET OF PAPER. QUICKLY, BUT CAREFULLY, PLACE THE PAPER ONTO THE BACKING MATERIAL AND PRESS OUT ANY AIR BUBBLES.

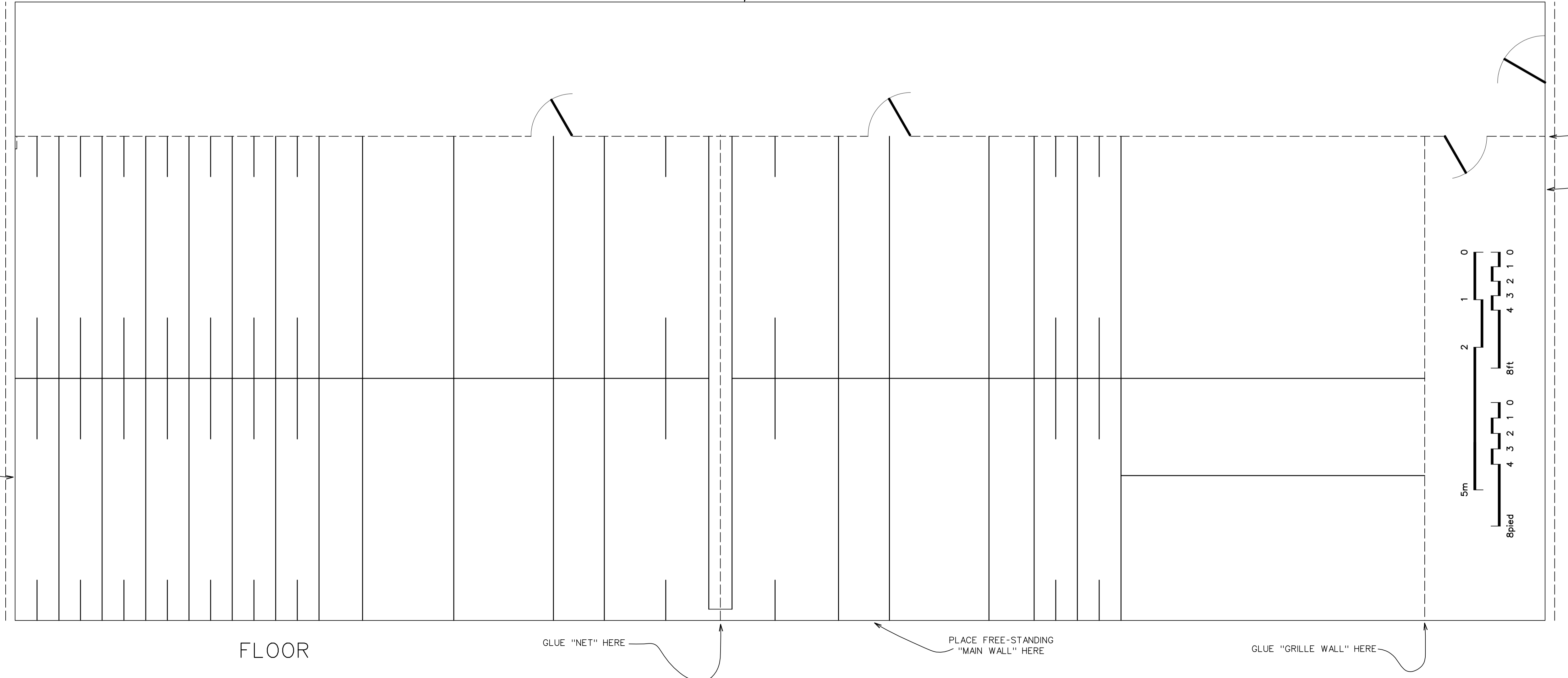
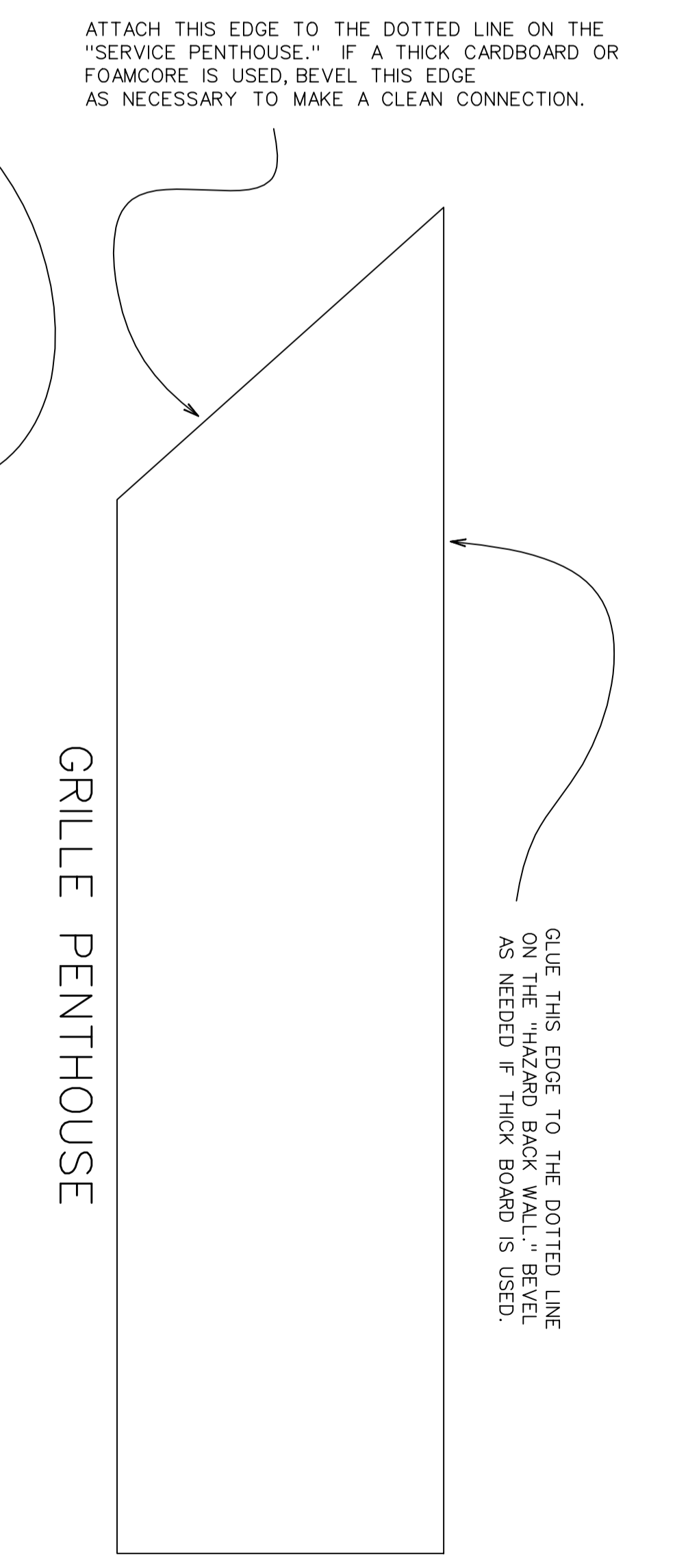
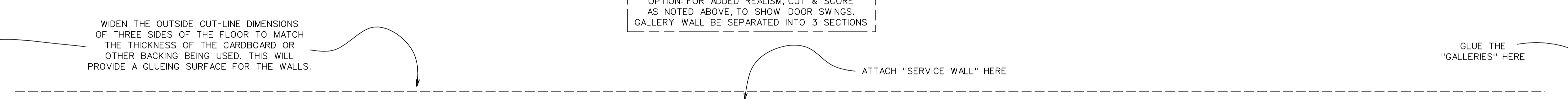
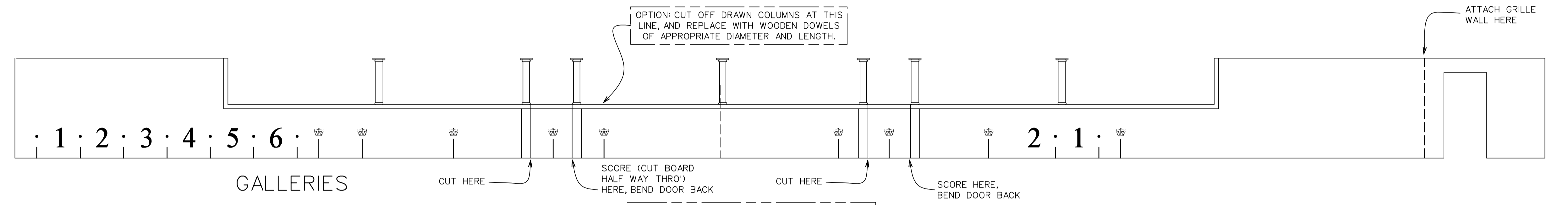
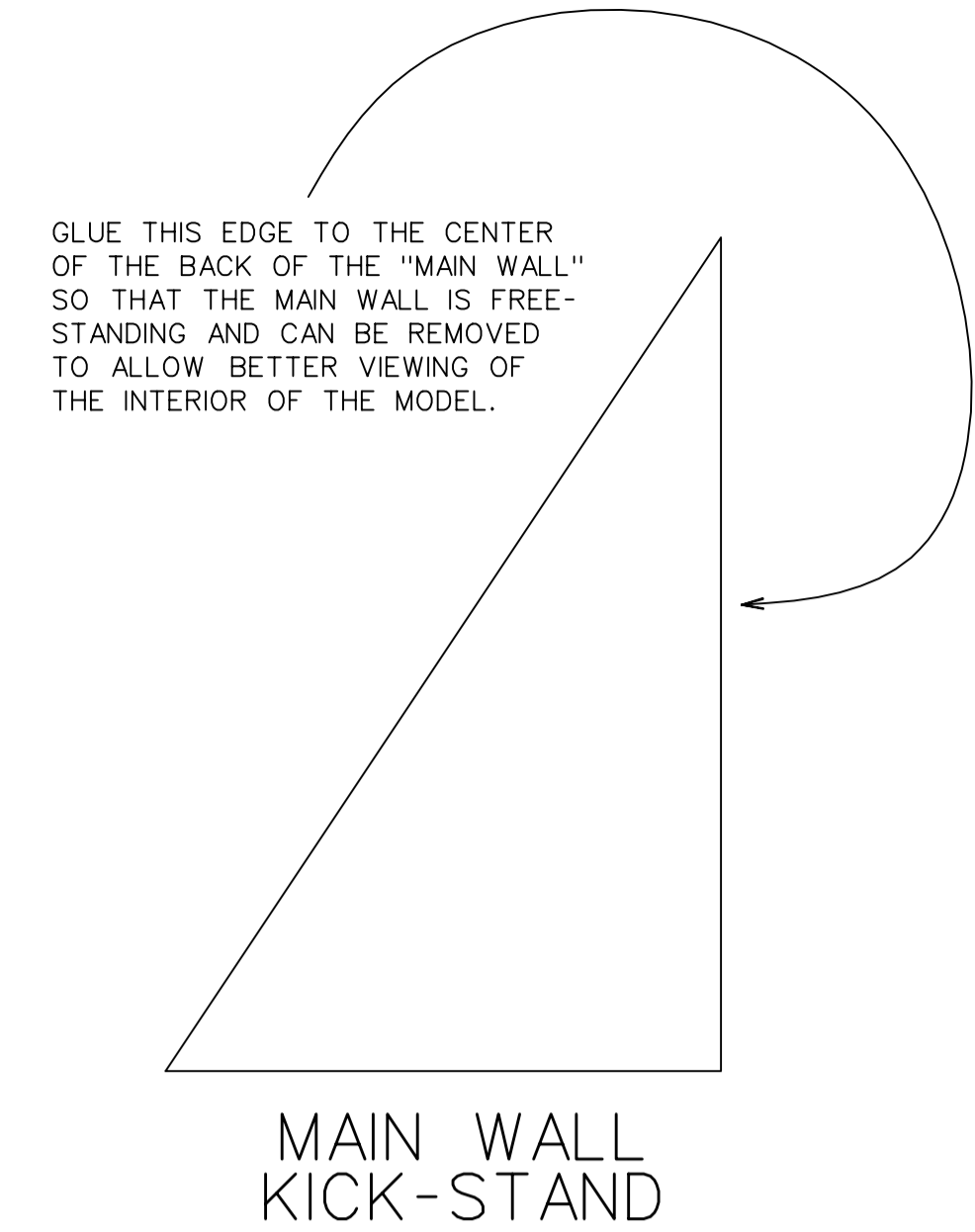
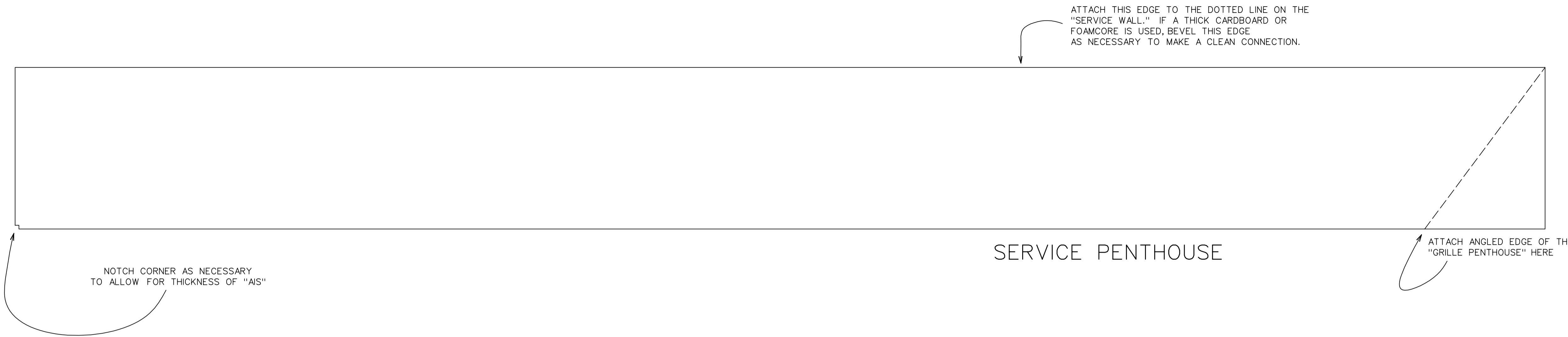
4) FINALLY, JUST CUT OUT THE PIECES AND ASSEMBLE AS NOTED. (KEEP A COPY OF EACH SHEET HANDY, AS YOU WILL CUT OFF THE NOTES AS YOU CUT OUT THE PIECES OF THIS "JEU QUARRE" COURT.)

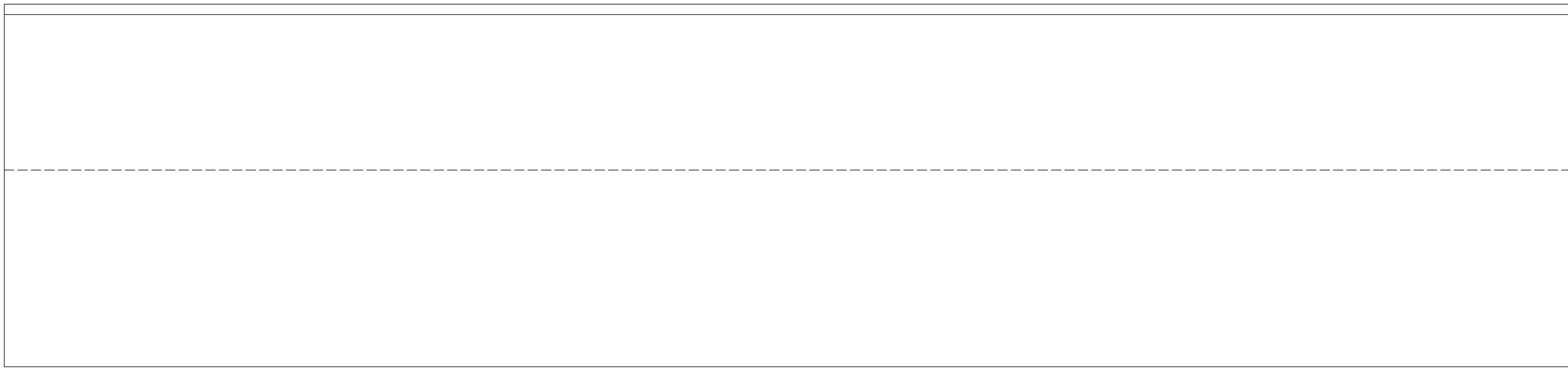
COURT FACTS:

- * Located in Falkland, Fife, Scotland.
- * Constructed between 1539 and 1541 for King James V of Scotland.
- * The world's only active and wellpreserved "Jeu Quarre" tennis court.
- * From Lunes Wall to Hazard Back Wall is 105'-8" (32205mm)
- * From Service Wall to Main Wall is 42'-8" (13010mm)
- * Floor is 97'-4" (29670mm) by 33'-5" (10185mm)
- * Walls are stucco over masonry, floor is flagstones, and the Ais, Grille, and Penthouses are wood.
- * An open-air court (i.e. no roof).

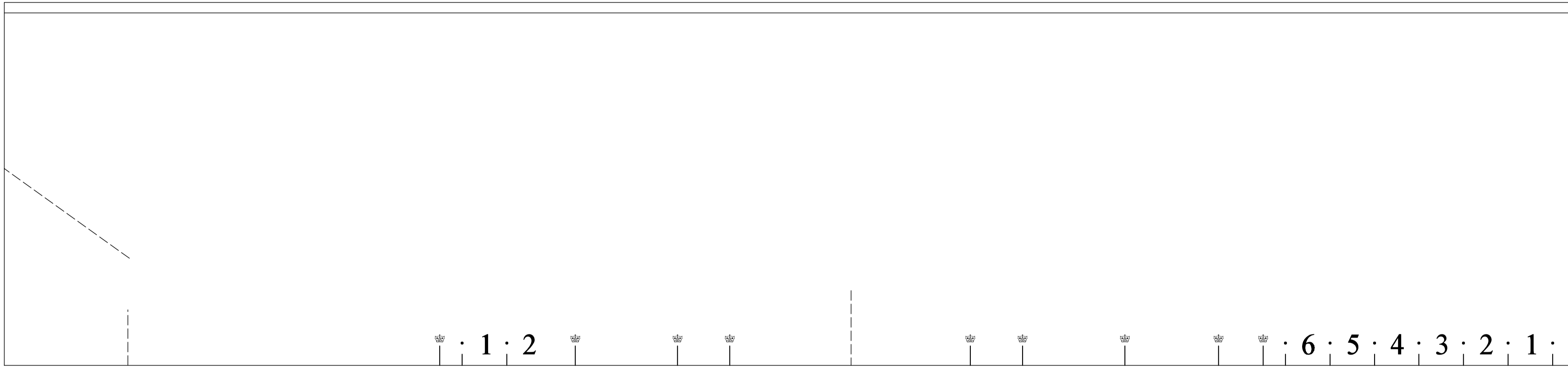


PERSPECTIVE DIAGRAM OF THE MODEL (MAIN WALL IN FOREGROUND, NOT SHOWN)

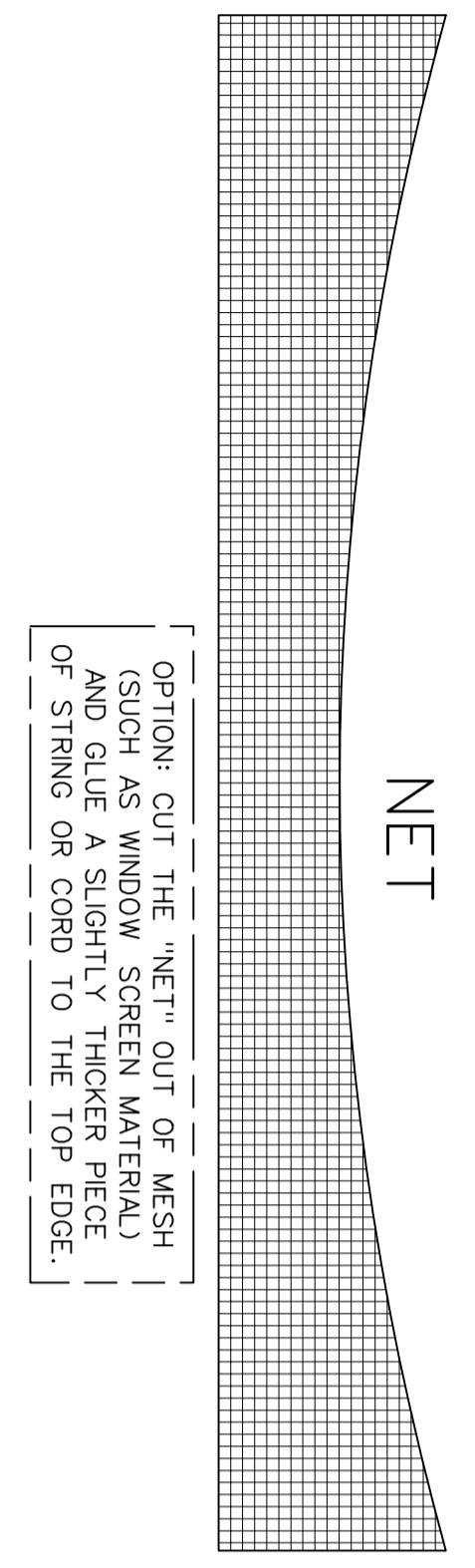


MAIN WALL

"GRILLE WALL" SHOULD LINE UP HERE

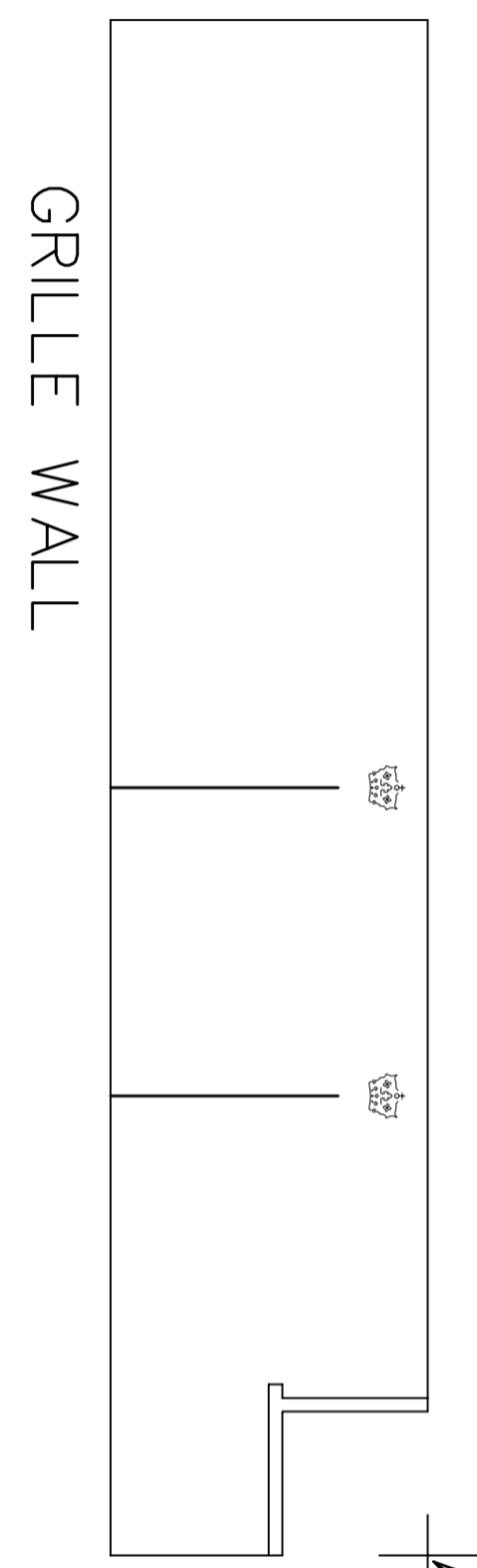
"NET" SHOULD LINE UP HERE

WIDEN THE OUTSIDE CUT-LINE DIMENSIONS OF THE BOTTOM OF THE MAIN WALL TO MATCH THE THICKNESS OF THE CARDBOARD OR OTHER BACKING BEING USED. THIS WILL ALLOW THE UPPER EDGE OF THIS WALL TO LINE UP WITH THE UPPER EDGES OF THE OTHER WALLS THAT ARE GLUED ONTO THE FLOOR PIECE.



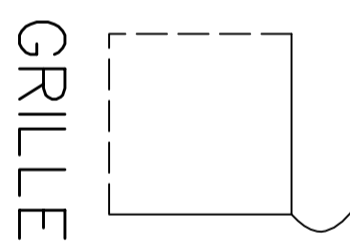
NET

OPTION: CUT THE "NET" OUT OF MESH (SUCH AS WINDOW SCREEN MATERIAL) AND GLUE A SLIGHTLY THICKER PIECE OF STRING OR CORD TO THE TOP EDGE.



GRILLE WALL

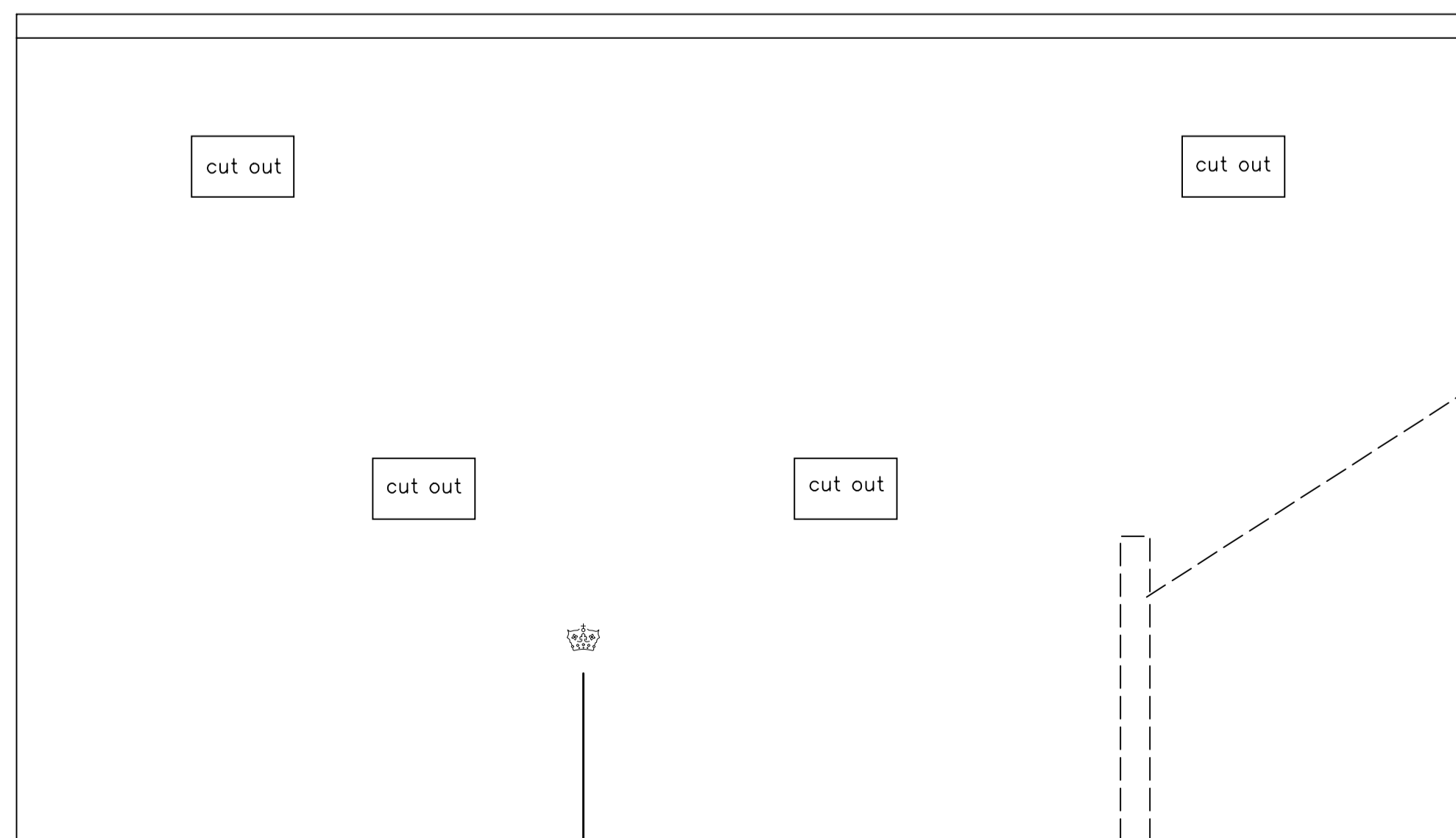
GLUE THE "GRILLE" TO THE BACK OF THE OPENING. THE DOTTED LINES INDICATE OVERLAPPING EDGES FOR GLUEING. LINE UP THE GRILLE CORNER (AS SHOWN) TO THE IMAGINARY INTERSECTION OF THE TOP AND SIDE EDGES OF THE GRILLE WALL.

OPTION: CUT THE "AIS" AND "GRILLE" OUT OF THIN Balsa WOOD.

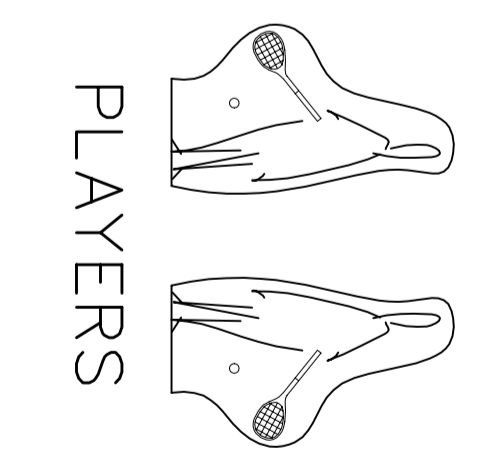

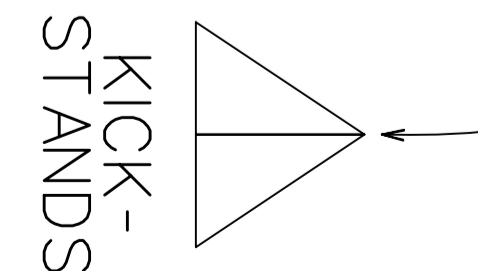

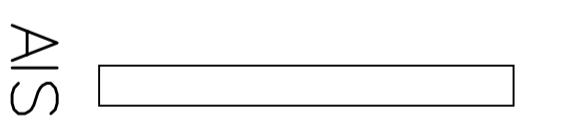
